Digestive System

Patient A:

A 60 year old woman experiencing diarrhea, vomiting, dizziness, and symptoms of the flu. How is this effecting her digestive system? What could be happening?

Patient B:

An 8 year old boy is unable to bear weight (not able to gain weight), fatigued, and complains of stomach pains. How is this effecting his digestive system? What could be happening?

Circulatory System

Patient A:

A 32 year old woman experiences a pain in her chest, nausea, cold sweats and dizziness. How is this effecting her circulatory system? What could be happening?

Patient B:

A 2 year old fell while trying to climb the stairs. He cried quite a bit and then you noticed that he had a goose egg and some bruising on his forehead. How is this effecting his circulatory system? What could be happening?

Respiratory System

Patient A:

A 16 year old boy is playing basketball when all of a sudden his chest feels tight and he is having difficulty breathing. He sits down but continues to wheeze. How is this effecting his respiratory system? What could be happening?

Patient B:

A 70 year old man who smoked his entire life came in complaining of a cough that will not go away, coughing up phlegm, and some weight loss. After doing some tests you find a large mass in his lungs. How is this effecting his respiratory system? What could be happening?

Excretory System

Patient A:

A 43 year old woman has severe pain in her lower back, below the ribs, that comes and goes. Her urine is red or pink and it is painful for her to urinate. She feels nauseated and has vomited a few times. How is this effecting her excretory system? What could be happening?

Patient B:

A 26 year old man is urinating very frequently (more often than usual). He also has a frequent sensation to urinate, his urine is cloudy and foul smelling. He has some pain in his lower abdomen and is running a fever. How is this effecting his excretory system? What could be happening?

Nervous System

Patient A:

A son brings in his elderly 78 year old mother as she is not able to recognize her family and friends. This was followed by increased memory loss, confusion and problems coping with new situations. How is this effecting her nervous system? What could be happening?

Patient B:

A 28 year old man trips and falls into the waiting room. He trips and falls often and has weakness in his legs and has difficulty doing his normal daily activities. He has hand weakness that leads to clumsiness and will at times have his shoulders, arms and tongue twitch. How is this effecting his nervous system? What could be happening?

Skeletal System

Patient A:

A teenage boy is climbing the jungle gym outside after school. He slips and falls off. He complains of pain in his right arm that gets worse when he moves it or applies pressure to it. There is swelling and a slight deformity. What happened to his arm?

Patient B:

A 36 year old woman is playing volleyball and goes to block someone. When she lands, she hears a loud pop or snap and falls to the ground. There is very sudden and severe pain in her knee. Her knee also feels very loose around the joint. She unable to walk on it. What do you think happened to her knee?
